## MTAC Convention 2023 "California Dreamin" - Hyatt Regency, Santa Clara, CA.

Esther Chang, Kristi Lobitz, and Dianne Harmel represented Pasadena Branch at the Convention June 30-July 3, 2023 in Santa Clara and have reported back on their experiences.

**Esther Yisi Chang** reflected that in her 30 years of attending the MTAC State Convention she always enjoys learning new things to improve her piano teaching, as well as meeting with friends and learning more about the success of MTAC across the state. Esther represented Pasadena Branch in the CalPlan meeting and has provided our Branch board with a detailed report of CalPlan requirements, which have largely remained the same as is recent years.

Esther's favorite sessions included Dr. Natsuki Fukasawa's lecture, "Teaching Music as Language: Laying the Foundation for Life-long Music Making." It featured concert pianist Tiffany Poon performing live in New York City with the *Spirio* device while live footage was broadcast to the convention audience in Santa Clara, California. As she played in NYC, the sound came from the Steinway Grand on stage at the Convention center with the action of the keys moving as viewers watched. The *SpirioCast* was also used in the final Artist Recital at the Convention with a globe-spanning duet. Pianist Greg Anderson, performing live at the Convention, played a duet with his duo partner, Liz Rowe who was in Rome, Italy. The new technology which allowed this live collaboration while at a distance was enthralling to the audience.
